To carry the Green Buddha Mark your centre should undertake the following 10 steps, with the Centre's Council's support:

- 1. We have conducted an Energy Audit at our Centre
- 2. We have taken steps to adopting the recommendations of our Energy Audit
- 3. We have a sustainability champion or kula reporting to the Centre Council
- 4. We have taken steps to become a Fairtrade Centre
- 5. We have changed the Centre's electricity supplier to 100% Green Energy
- 6. We promote veganism at our Centre and only purchase vegan products where possible.
- 7. We are promoting public transport and car-sharing to the Centre and retreats
- 8. We are moving towards a comprehensive recycling policy in the Centre
- 9. We are displaying this certificate proudly.
- 10. We take part in BAM (Buddhist Action Month) and ask our Sangha members to take on personal 'Green Precepts
