

Triratna in the Buddhist world

- Triratna actively works with other Buddhists
- In fact Triratna is one of just 3 or 4 Buddhist organisations in **Europe** who support someone with money to work with other Buddhists.
- This may indicate we are one of the most outward-facing Buddhist movements in the world.

Triratna in the Buddhist world

- 1-4 million Buddhists in Europe (mostly Germany, Italy, France and UK)
- About 250,000 Buddhists in the UK, 9000 in Ireland
- Triratna, the NKT and SGI-UK are the three largest Buddhist organisations in the UK
- But more than 60% of UK's Buddhists are minority ethnic
- Triratna is 99% white (outside India)
- And most of Europe's Buddhists don't belong to any organisation
- Conclusion: Triratna is very significant but not representative!



What I do

- Help with NBO and EBU websites and Facebook pages, keeping information flowing around
- Drafted EBU Statement on the 2015 European refugee crisis
- Bringing Buddhist Action Month from the NBO to Triratna, and inspiration back from Triratna to the NBO! (Triratna most active in BAM so far.)
- Presentation about Triratna to the EBU meeting in September 2015.
- EBU audience impressed, especially with our Young Buddhist project

Buddhist Teachers in Europe

- A 3-day meeting following the EBU meeting every year
- EBU and BTE show how extremely unusual Triratna is.

Why bother?

- Ensuring friendly relations with other Buddhist traditions.
- Enabling others to learn from Triratna (and vice versa).
- Understanding Triratna better, by comparison, and helping Triratna understand itself better.
- Working together for the flourishing of Buddhism in Europe.
- Enabling Buddhist thinking and values to affect public policy, through political institutions.
- Creating a culture more favourable to Buddhist life.

How Triratna is viewed: 1

- Among those we work with, respected and appreciated: we have turned up and DONE STUFF, harmoniously and co-operatively and for many years.
- Most Buddhist organisations not interested in working together
- UK Buddhist chaplaincy group impressed with Triratna chaplains.
- Shenpen Hookham's praise for Bhante's achievements
- We're also active in UK prison chaplaincy.

How Triratna is viewed: 2

- Probably few understand us because we are so unusual:
 - The Order, not lay, not monastic, is a huge single worldwide ordained sangha
 - not just a lot of individual "teachers" from one vertical lineage, teaching in separate little sanghas.
 - Our centres are all legally independent.
 - We're not legally registered in any one country.
- There are still critics out there: people with no recent experience of us.
- Relatively little online controversy about us.

Other liaison work

- Triratna in other European countries has varying but generally low levels of involvement with other Buddhists
- But some individual centres do work with other Buddhists (and other faiths) locally – eg Birmingham, Glasgow, Berlin, Melbourne
